Hugh Evans began his humanitarian work at the age of fourteen when he was the inaugural Youth Ambassador for World Vision Australia. Since that time Hugh has been extensively involved in development work in a range of countries including South Africa, Ghana and Indonesia. In 2003 Hugh established the Oaktree Foundation and in 2004 was named Young Australian of the Year. At just 25 years old, Hugh has been mentored by some of Australia's most prominent leaders including Prime Minister Kevin Rudd. Currently he is undertaking his Masters of International Relations at Cambridge University.
